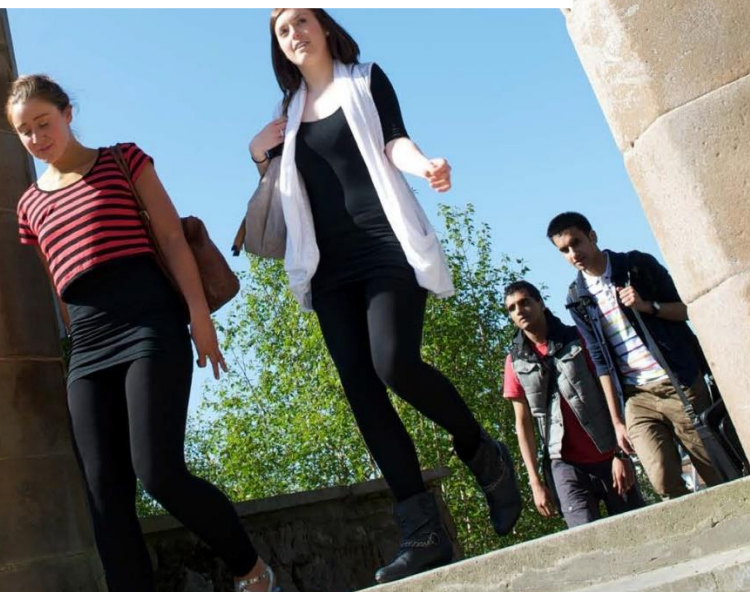

## Semester Study

Our semester programmes aim to build on existing areas of interest, provide new experiences and encourage comparative studies between China and Scotland/ wider UK. Previous students have used their semester experience to support applications for further masters and doctoral study in the UK and other English speaking countries.

Students attending Strathclyde for a one-semester programme will normally undertake 3 modules.

The expertise within the Faculty of Humanities means that there is scope to be flexible in terms of content and we will endeavour, wherever possible, to meet students' individual needs. The semester programme has the potential to draw upon content from:

- Teacher Education/ Education Studies
- Modern Languages: French, Spanish, Italian and Mandarin
- Psychological Sciences and Health
- History
- Government and Public Policy
- English Literature
- Journalism, Media and Communication
- Social Work and Social Policy
- Law

Classes can change each year and students will be advised on what is available at the point of application.

Successful completion will result in up to 60 credits within the Scottish Credit and Qualifications Framework (SCQF). These credits are recognised internationally and, by arrangement with partner universities, may be accepted for class exemption. **Students may also choose to attend a programme on an experiential basis with no credit transfer.**



## Support for Students

Staff within the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences are here to support the welfare and academic progress of all students.

Bilingual staff will be on hand to assist in the application process and to support students during their time at Strathclyde. Students will meet with a nominated adviser of studies on a regular basis to review their progress towards successful outcomes.



Visiting international students are also entitled to 5 hours of English language classes per week to assist their personal and academic development and these may attract credit in agreement with the students' own university.



Our outstanding library services are open 24-hours a day, through term time, giving students access to a huge range of reading resources. Electronic access to quality international journal databases is available anywhere on campus through our Wi-Fi network.

## Entry Requirements for International Students

It is normally expected that you display competence in English through attaining an IELTS score. Students with CET score 6.0 are also encouraged to contact us for further advice.

Successful applicants should apply for a short-term study visa.
